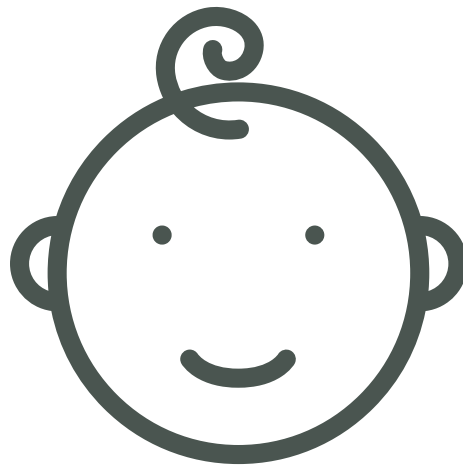


# Who can I read to?

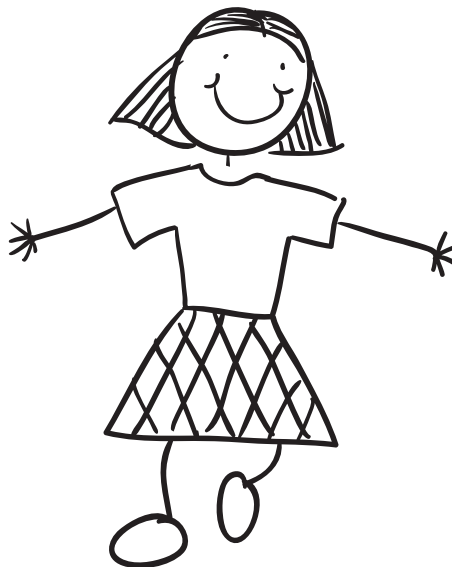

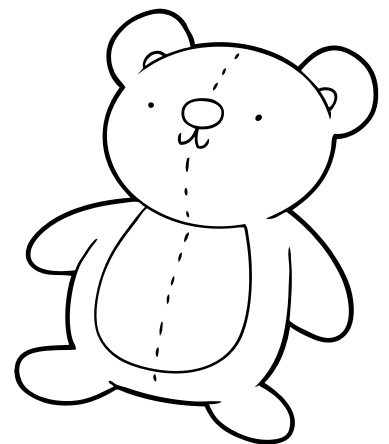
